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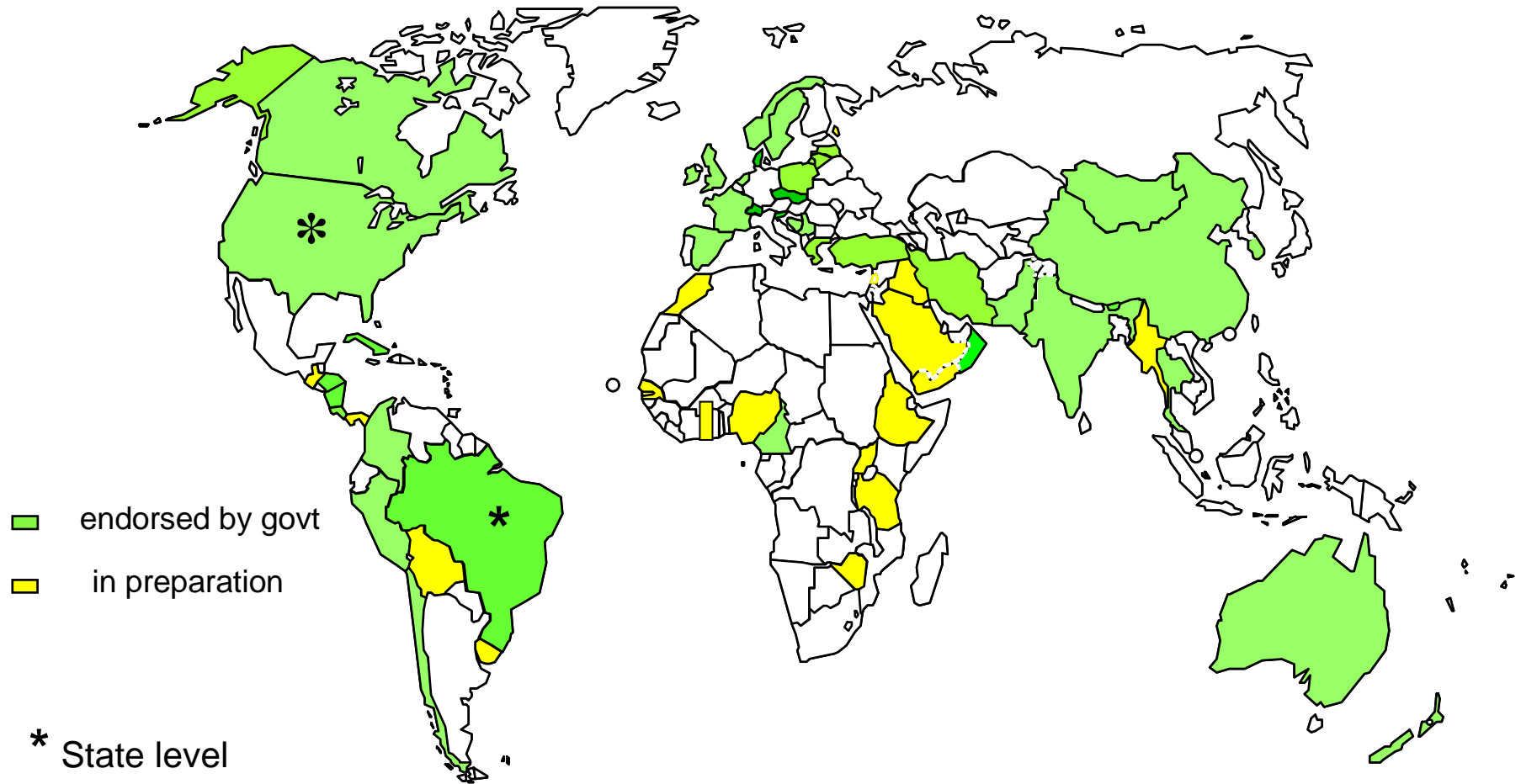

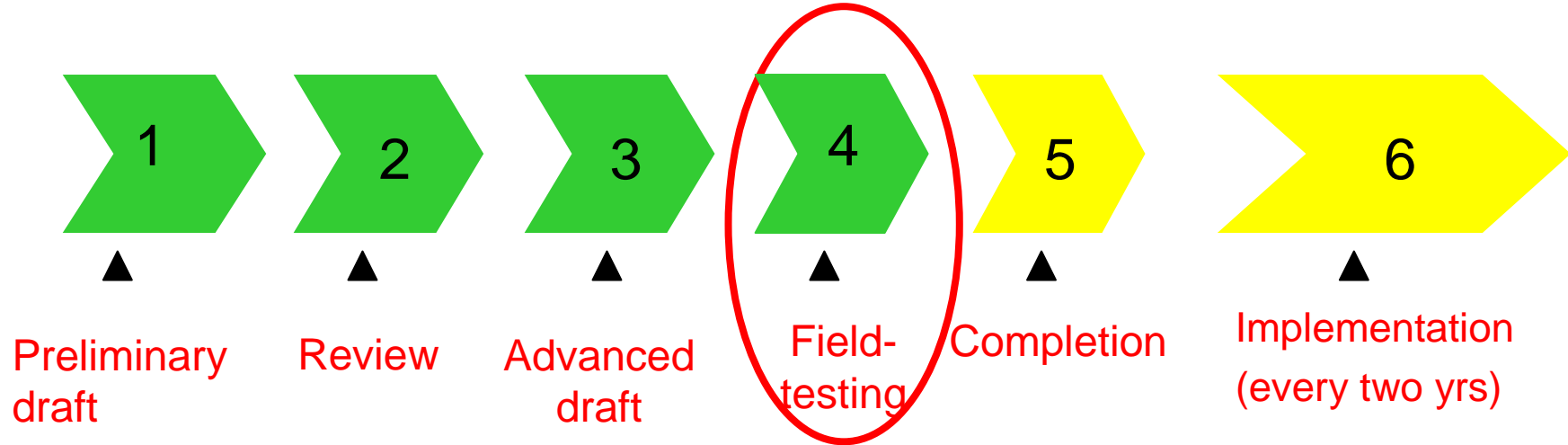

NCCP Capacity Assessment: the context

- NCCP capacity assessment is part of a WHO broader surveillance system for NCDs
- The joint WHO-IAEA programme focuses on the promotion of NCCPs and includes the development of standardized tools for monitoring and evaluation:
 - ❖ **Core self-assessment tool (field-tested)**
 - ❖ Expanded self-assessment tool (in preparation)

OBJECTIVES

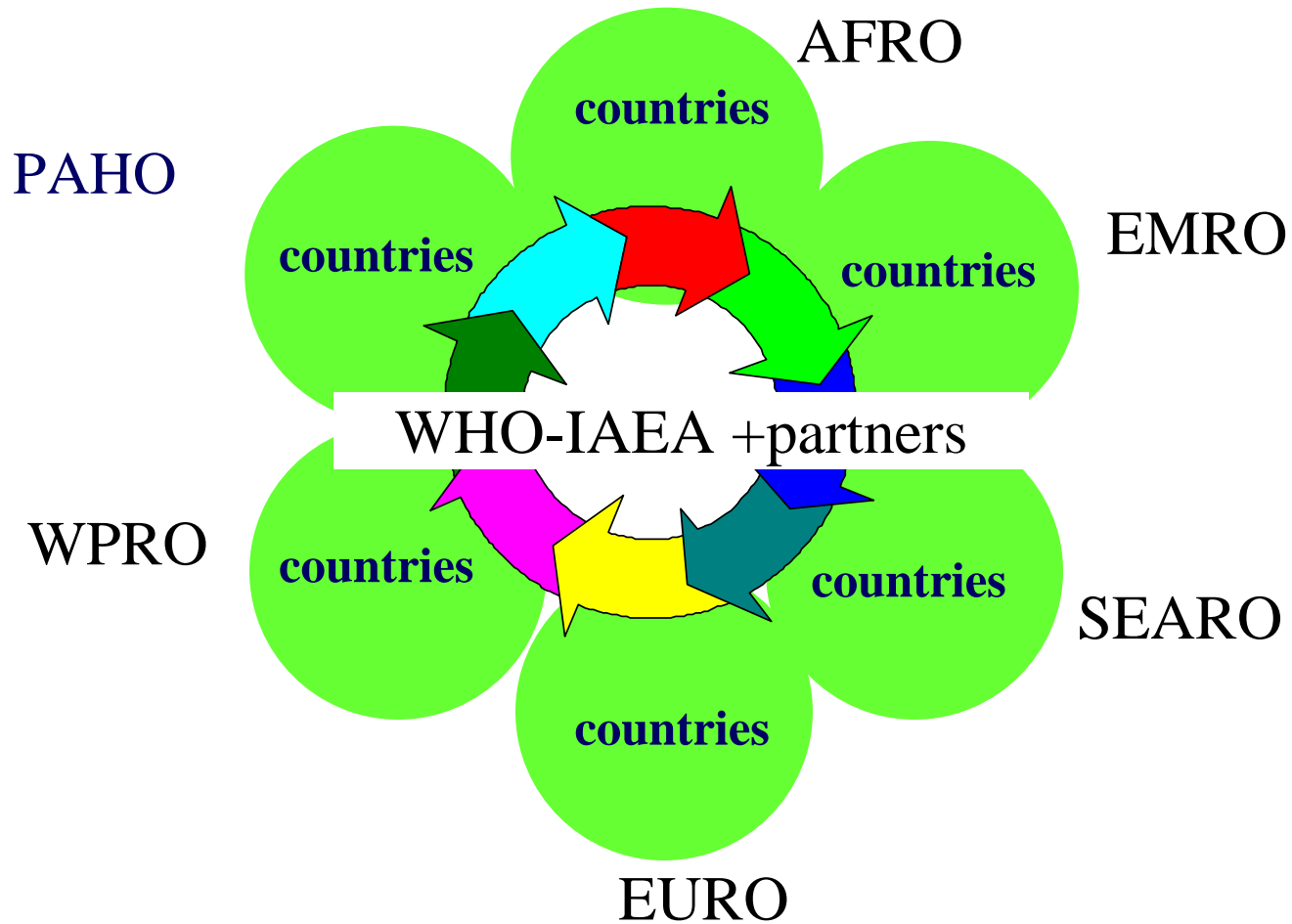
From the countries' perspective

- Assess the current cancer control plan, ongoing core activities and availability of key resources for managing the programme

From the WHO- IAEA's perspective

- Assess the current plan, core activities and resources **at national, regional and global levels**
- Guide on assistance required by countries based on their specific situation and needs.
- Facilitate the development of a WHO web-based international cancer control community on NCCPs

NCCP Capacity Assessment: a collaborative model national, regional, global



Core self-assessment tool

- **Primary audience:** national and international public health community
- **Expected coverage:** all countries
- **Type:** simple, **qualitative** assessment, with close-ended questions that can be completed within two months
- **Methodology:** multidisciplinary/ multisectoral team convened by MoHs fills in the approved completed questionnaire online (DataCol) or word format

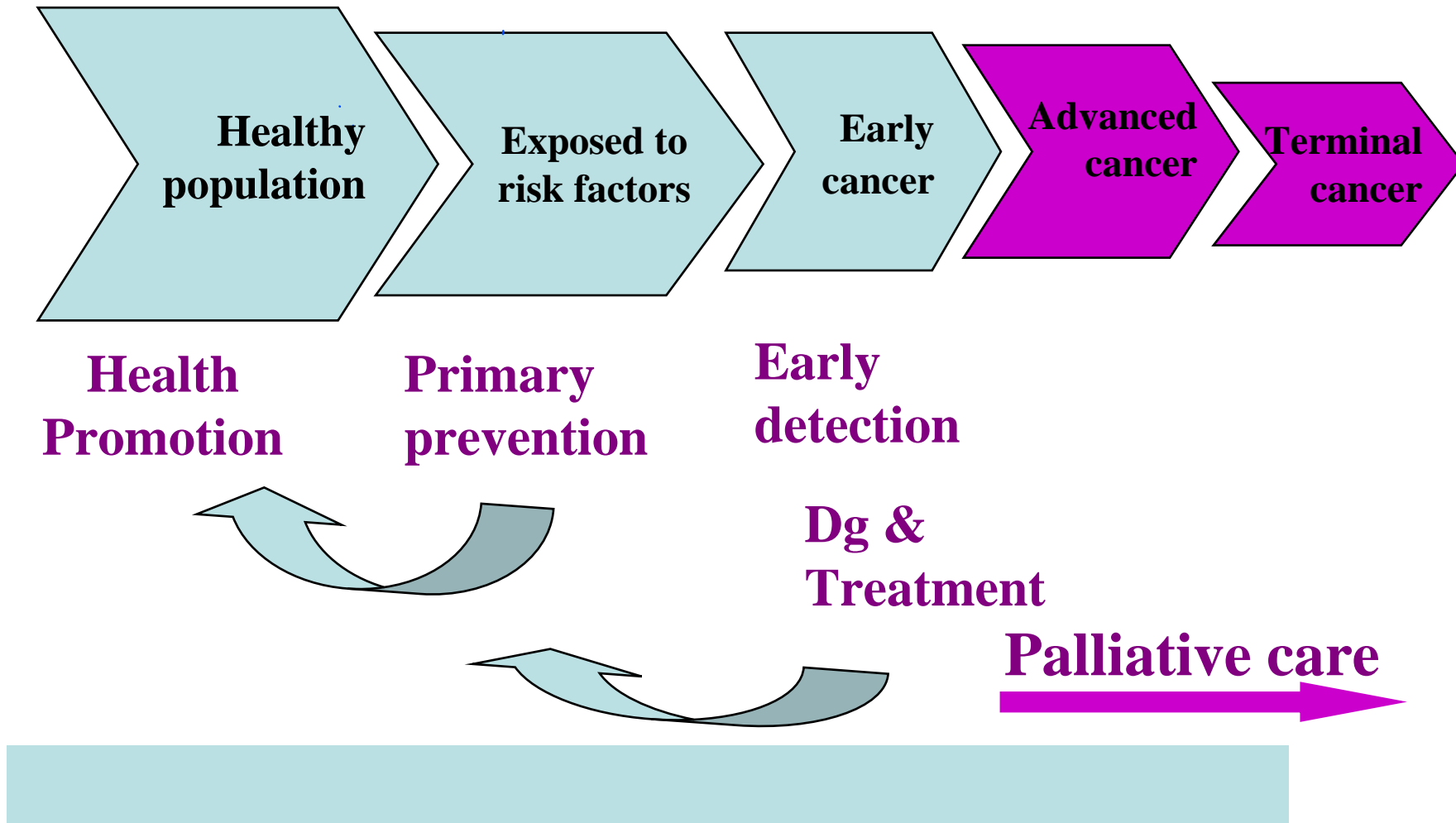

Assessment of interventions across the cancer control continuum is central to the tool:



Sections of the core assessment tool

1. Cancer control plan
2. Ongoing activities across the cancer control continuum
3. Ongoing cancer activities and resources related to programme management
4. Current barriers and strengths of cancer control
5. Identification of the country and respondents

NOT included:

- cancer burden and cancer risk factors (WHO Data base)
- demographic and socioeconomic data (UNDP)
